A large man, NATE, walks over to an average size girl, LUCY, 23. Lucy is a little awkward and out of place. Both are wearing bright orange Fix It Depot aprons, Lucy's is cleaner. We hear her narrate.

LUCY (V.O.)

Someone once said, "Work to live not live to work."

NATE

'Sup, I'm Nate, you're Lucy right?

LUCY

Yup, that's me.

NATE

I'm the supervisor in the floor and decor department, I'm gonna train you how to cut carpet.

LUCY

Well, I already know how to cut the rug if you know what I mean.

Lucy gives a cheesy wink and tries to motion dancing. Nate just stares at her blankly.

NATE

Listen, I don't care if you a lesbian or somethin' but I gotta show you how to do this for real.

LUCY

But that's not what I meant. It's dancing...

Nate walks off, Lucy sighs and follows him.

LUCY (V.O.)

That guy obviously didn't have rent to pay.

INT. THE APARTMENT LIVING ROOM - MORNING

Lucy walks into living room wearing pajamas. DAG, a very attractive girl also in her 20's is sitting on the couch with her laptop out pretty occupied with watching cat videos. Smoke surrounds them, the source of this is weed. OLIVIA, a quirky, hipster artist type that is always a little off, is sewing up a stuffed animal. Lucy plops down

on a recliner. Dag wakes up out of her HTC-fused cat video daze.

DAG

Morning, El, how was day one last yesterday?

LUCY

Well...

CUT TO:

INT. FIX IT DEPOT -- DAY

Nate and Lucy stand in front of a carpet cutting machine.

NATE

Alright, now you take this piece and slip it underneath, make sure it's okay and it's ready for it before you start cutting it.

Especially the plush, it's thicker but softer and gentler, kind of carpet. You just gotta take care if it and slip it under when it's ready, you know what I'm saying?

LUCY

Well should I take it out to dinner? Or movies? is it a fan of Chris Hemsworth? Because I am, yowza.

LUCY (V.O.)

Who says "yowza?"

Nate just looks at her very seriously.

LUCY

Sorry, I'm kidding. Just trying to lighten the mood.

NATE

Listen, I don't know if you're a lesbian or like to date textile floor coverings but cutting carpet is serious business.

LUCY

What? No I was just saying that because--

CONTINUED: 3.

NATE

(Cuts her off)

It's an art, you know what I'm saying? And Picasso ain't no clown. If you want you can buy a piece and use that for whatever you want but...

CUT TO:

INT. APARTMENT -- DAY

Back to the apartment where Lucy, Olivia, and Dag are.

DAG

Whoa so, he thinks you're a carpet muncher both figuratively and literally.

LUCY

Yup, that and I got hit on by two old men today, at least my fears of being thought of as a lesbian because I work cutting carpet have evaporated. How about you, Pepperoni Pam?

Lucy lightly kicks Dag's laptop.

DAG

(simply)

Oh, I got fired.

CUT TO:

EXT. PIZZA PARADISE -- DAY

Dag is dressed as Pepperoni Pam, a giant pepperoni, standing outside waving people into the Pizza Paradise. A LITTLE BOY walks up to her. Dag narrates.

DAG (V.O.)

I was just doing my job, being friendly and waving and then HE came along and ruined everything.

DAG

(as Pepperoni Pam, has higher voice) Hey little dude, what's your name? CONTINUED: 4.

LITTLE BOY

I don't like you!

DAG

I'm sorry to hear that, but don't you like pizza? Everyone loves pizza!

LITTLE BOY

I hate pizza and you!

Little boy kicks Dag.

DAG

Hey, that's not nice!

LITTLE BOY

You are gross!

Little boy kicks her again.

DAG

That's mean! Stop that! And pepperoni isn't gross, it's delicious! Where's your mom?!

LITTLE BOY

You can't tell me what to do!

Little boy keeps kicking her. Little boy laughs.

DAG

Alright that's it!

Dag takes her face off showing her own face. She bends down, and is now face to face with the little boy.

DAG (CONT'D)

(angry and dramatic)

Your mother ignores you because she doesn't love you. Nobody loves you. You are going to be alone for the rest of your life until you shrivel up and die a lonely old man with lots of annoying cats or birds and NO PIZZA.

Little boy starts crying. DAG'S BOSS steps outside and sees the commotion, he points to Dag.

DAG'S BOSS

You! You're gone!

INT. APARTMENT -- DAY

Back at the apartment to Lucy, Olivia, and Dag.

LUCY

That was was not smart, Dag.

OLIVIA

Yeah, I mean we all have an outlook on people and some are not the most positive and filled with green chill -- especially children because they are giant babies still but with hair. You shouldn't have done that.

LUCY

Right. (beat) Now you're back to square one with the game.

DAG

Whatever, I'll still beat you guys this month.

Olivia and Lucy laugh in disbelief.

DAG (CONT'D)

I will!

LUCY (V.O.)

"The Game," I know you're confused, let me explain.

CUT TO:

EXT. APARTMENT BACKYARD -- NIGHT

Lucy, Dag, Olivia, and CHLOE, a naturally pretty girl similar in age to the others, all are sitting in front of a fire pit, all drinking and smoking.

LUCY (V.O.)

Nobody likes being underemployed or unemployed so we wanted to do something about it.

LUCY

I just don't understand how we work our asses off in college and we can't even get jobs after we graduate.
